VIDEO REQUIREMENTS



Start your video by stating your full name and the piece and scale you will be performing. Each student should choose one piece and a scale to practice.

Videos should be filmed as if they were "live," using the highest quality audio or video recording equipment possible. The video should be one take (no editing or stopping mid-recording).

Make sure your camera is steady. Consider using a tripod or additional stand if you have access to one.

Length: Your practice video should be ten minutes long

Get the right camera placement: Make sure the camera angle provides a clear view of the left hand and wrist. You will also need a clear view of the bow on the strings.

Please include your full name in your title of your video.

You may upload your video to google drive or iCloud and share the link on this task. Be sure that your video privacy is set on "Anyone with the link can view."

We will also accept submissions by uploading your video to YouTube, Vimeo, or another video hosting service.

Before submitting your video, test it out first by previewing the URL in a different browser or sending it to another family member. Make sure you are not logged into the video sharing site platform while accessing the link.

If you choose to use a video sharing site to upload your video, consider that the uploads are public and generally accessible through search results. You may wish to restrict who can view your recording, but you need to make sure we are able to access the video. On YouTube, <u>setting your video to Unlisted</u> will allow anyone with the link to view your video.
